GENERAL INFORMATION WITH REGARD TO FORMING A PROFESSIONAL CORPORATION

If planning to form a Professional Corporation to render psychological services, you will need an <u>Application for Certificate of Registration of Professional Corporation to</u> <u>Engage in Practice of Psychology</u> and the <u>Instructions for Completing</u> the application. Any licensee of the North Carolina Psychology Board (i.e., a Licensed Psychologist, a provisionally Licensed Psychologist, or a Licensed Psychological Associate) may apply for the certification.

Before you can submit Articles of Incorporation to the Secretary of State's office, you are required to obtain a <u>Certification of Application</u> from the Psychology Board's office as directed below. Refer to the **NOTE** on the first page of the instructions if planning a joint formation between other approved professional groups. For more information, refer to the Secretary of State's website at <u>www.secretary.state.nc.us/Corporations</u> (Corporations Divison). You may also call their office at (919) 807-2225 or toll-free at (888) 246-7636.

The Board's application process is as follows:

- An applicant must complete the Application for Certificate of Registration of Professional Corporation and return it to the Board's office along with a \$50 application fee and a copy of the proposed Articles of Incorporation. A <u>Certification of Application</u> will be returned to the applicant to be used for filing with the Secretary of State's office along with the Articles of Incorporation. (NOTE: This form is NOT the <u>final Certificate of</u> Registration.)
- After the Secretary of State's office has approved the Articles of Incorporation, a complete copy (not just the cover page) of such reflecting the Secretary of State's seal **MUST** be sent to the Board's office.
- 3) Upon receipt by the Board of the approved copy of the Articles of Incorporation, a <u>Certificate of Registration</u> will be issued to the applicant. Pursuant to G.S. § 55B-10, "No professional corporation shall open, operate, or maintain an establishment for any of the purposes set forth in this Chapter without first having obtained a certificate of registration from the licensing board or boards."
